Attendance Matters: Facts about irregular school attendance
Regular absences from school can affect:

- attainment levels - the quality of school work, qualifications gained
- school routine - disrupting your child's learning and that of the other pupils
- the chances of children and young people being involved in anti-social behaviour a child or young person's general wellbeing and long term life opportunities
- improving regular attendance at school is therefore a key priority, both locally and nationally

Reception: All our Reception class are now settled beautifully into school enjoying their new learning environment. I am so proud of the first-class start they have all made with their learning and beginning their journey at St Nicholas.

The Reception/Year 6 Buddy assembly is on $2^{\text {nd }}$ September at 3pm, come along and join us.

Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in both primary and secondary school. The Education (School Day and School Year) (England) Regulations 1999 require all maintained schools to open to educate their pupils for at least 190 days ( 380 sessions) in each school year.

Table 1 puts absence in the context of the day's children miss at school based on a school being opened for 190 days per year
